G = Golden Horseshoe


 Zone that lies around the southern end of Lake Ontario and includes Toronto. About ¼ of all Canadians live in this zone!

N = Natural resources


 Because many of the natural resources of Canada are found in remote areas, Canadians are spread across the country.

 About 33 million people. Small compared to its land area.




Q = Quite rainy

R = What mountain range does Canada and US share?








S = St. Lawrence Sea Way Connects the Great Lakes to Atlantic Ocean.


V = Very Good Soil
